The Smithsonian's [Recovering Voices](#) initiative is proud to present its [second annual Mother Tongue Film Festival](#). The festival runs from **February 21 to February 25, 2017** at select locations across the Smithsonian and Washington, D.C.

The five-day festival will open on United Nations Mother Language Day, Tuesday, Feb. 21, and will feature 32 films representing 33 languages across 6 continents. The festival presents films on music, identity and place from communities around the world.

The Recovering Voices Mother Tongue Film Festival is a collaborative event supported and organized by the three Smithsonian Recovering Voices partners across the Institution: National Museum of the American Indian, National Museum of Natural History and the Center for Folklife and Cultural Heritage. This program has received federal support from the Latino Initiatives Pool, administered by the Smithsonian Latino Center, and additional support from the Mexican Cultural Institute and the New Zealand Embassy.
